THE HISTORICAL BACKGROUND:

Hatichong College, the only educational institute, imparting higher education in the three Mouzas- Hatichong, Silpukhuri, and Mikirbheta (Morigaon District) was founded on 1st August 1988 nearby kujidah H.S School in the district of Nagaon, Assam. Hatichong College is situated at a distance of about 115 KMS from Guwahati, the capital city of Assam and about 12 KMS from the district Head Quarter Nagaon. As the ultimate consequence of a general meeting held on the 19th of April 1987 at Kujidah, the institute was set up temporarily at Kujidah H.S. School (inside) campus containing 45 students and 10 teachers in 1988 and shifted to present Bhawan in 1993. The college has now blossomed with an enrolment of 663 students in B.A programme with its own campus of 5.95 Acres of land. The pioneers, emerging from the mentioned mouzas are to be revealed a note of gratitude on this behalf. It would be worthwhile to draw attention to a pivotal speciality that the college is pragged with an effort to fulfill the burning desire for higher education in such a rural region. The healthy flourishing of the college in such a rural base will surely come to the help of needy students to achieve their higher goals of learning. Over the years, the college has produced many illustrious personalities from various walks of life. The College is affiliated to Guwahati University and registered under 2(F) and 12(B) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956. Recently(on 4th and 5th May 2023) Hatichong College has been accredited by NAAC and graded B++ in its first Cycle with CGPA 2.81. Besides, two certificate courses (Computer Education and Beautician), the core subjects offered by the college are Assamese, English, Economics, Political Science, Education, History and Geography having honours course in Assamese, English, Economics and Political Science. The college developed 3 ICT-enabled classrooms to meet the present need of the students. There is a central library in the college having about eleven thousand collections of books and journals. Keeping in tune with the below vision and mission, the college has been striving to spread quality education to poor and backward students in all aspects. Besides producing graduates in arts, the college also aims at identifying and

Hatichong College is going to implement Four Year Undergraduate Graduate Progamme(FYUGP) of Gauhati University under NEP 2020 from the session 2023-24. The FYUGP is based on a new curricular framework as envisaged under the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) by the University Grants Commission (UGC) on the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) mode.

About Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS). Though, the FYUGP is basically a CBCS, it is radically different from the courses running under CBCS. Namely, it does not differentiate between so-called Honours and Pass courses existing under CBCS. Basically, the FYUGP is based on the system of education under Liberal arts.

Salient features of FYUGP

Structure-wise, the present Bachelor"s Degree programme under the CBCS is a 3-year degree programme at the end of which, a student will be awarded a Bachelor"s Degree in Arts,Science, or Commerce. One can also have a Bachelor"s of Vocation degree, being run in some colleges, which in short form known as the BVoc degree. The two systems – Bachelor"s Course under CBCS and Bachelor"s Course under the FYUGP of NEP are different in the followingways.

• Duration

While under CBCS, one has a 3-year degree programme, under the NEP"s FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme.

Exits & Entries

Under CBCS, one needs to complete the full 3-year programme in order to get a degree. There is no provision for dropping out of the programme in the middle. While in the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one

gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

IMPORTANT: If you exit in the middle, the doors are still open for you to enter into the programme again and you can start the journey from where you left. No such provisions exist in the CBCS.

Honours and Major

Under the CBCS, we either have Bachelor"s Degree (Honours) or a regular Bachelor"s Degree. In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor"s Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 year.


Progression

If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master"s programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, s/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master"s programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master"s Degree. Under CBCS, there were no such pathways.

• Progression to Doctoral Studies

Once a student takes admission into a Master"s programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor"s programme or after FYUGP, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master"s programme.

How different are the courses?

The major differentiator between the FYUGP and the existing CBCS is the student's ability to study different subjects of choice and also the ability to switch between subjects. Basically, there are two parts of a course under the FYUGP - (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses. As the name suggests, different students study different core courses and all students study the common courses. Below, we describe what you will study in different parts of the programme.

• First Year (Semester I & II)

In the first year, one studies three different core subjects – one paper of each subjects per semester. Besides, one needs to study a host of common subjects that are designed as per UGC"s Curricular Framework.

• Second Year (Semester III & IV)

- Semester III

In the third semester, one will usually continue with the same core subjects that have already been chosen in the first year and again study some common subjects. In the third semester, one will also take a step forward to study the favourite subject by declaring one of the core subjects as a Major subject and other two as Minors.

However, the structure of the programme remains same as in first & second semesters.

Semester IV

From Semester IV onwards, one will primarily study the Major subject by taking at least four papers, some of which may be elective depending on the subject concerned. same as the first & second semesters, one will have the option of changing the Major in fourth semester to any one of the other two Minors as well, even if one has already declared a Major in the third semester. However this has the condition that the new Major subject of choice has vacancy.

• Third Year

In the third year, one will continue to study the Major subject to complete a full set of 15 papers in Majors.

• Fourth Year

If one intends to progress to the fourth year, s/he will be devoting the time in studying advanced courses which will be at the level of initial Master's degree papers. Besides, one will also have the opportunity of engaging into research work with the faculty members.

Besides the above, there are some more unique features of the FYUGP. They are

• Open Core Credits

From fourth to sixth semester, one will have time for 4 optional open core credits per semester, which one can utilise to study either of the Major or two Minors. They can also come handy, if one had changed a Minor subject in between.

• Double Major


If a student is ready to do some more hard work, s/he can take some extra online courses (from designated sources only) related to the Minors and can then convert one of the Minors to a second Major by the time one completes 3 / 4 years of study. This is over and above the first Major. In this case, one will have a Bachelor"s Degree with Double Major.

Subject Groups & Course Verticals

Subject Groups

We describe here the **Course Groups** and **Course Verticals**. The verticals are groups of subjects for Major and Minors, from which one can choose subjects subject to conditions, which can vary from one vertical to another. There will be however NO conditions to choose subjects between different verticals.

The verticals are themselves are parts of **Subject Groups**. Some sample Subject Groups are shown below.



Course Structure (3-Year Degree)

The detailed course structure for a 3-Year Bachelor Degree is represented in the figure below. This structure depicts a general scenario where a student will chose one major course and two minor courses. It is to be noted that in order for a re-entry into the 3-Year course in Semester III or V for students who have opted for leaving the course after the 1st and 2nd year respectively, additional vocational course of 4-credit has to be done by the student on exit.

We give here four examples for

1. 3-Year Bachelor Degree with one major and two minors

Degree obtained:

Bachelor Degree in Arts with Major in History and Minor in Political Science and Economics

2. 3-Year Bachelor Degree with one major and two minors with an elective paper on Research Methodology in 5th Semester

Degree obtained:

Bachelor Degree in Arts with Major in History and Minor in Political Science and Economics

3. 3-Year Bachelor Degree with no major and minors


Degree obtained:

Bachelor Degree in Arts

4. 3-Year Bachelor Degree with one minor and option for double major

Degree obtained:

Bachelor Degree in Arts with Major in History and Minor in Political Science and Economics



Credit Framework

Each semester of a 4-Year Bachelor Degree (FYUGP) course will have a **maximum** of 22 credits with a total of 132 credits for 3-Year Degree Course and 176 credits for a 4-Year Degree Course. Apparently, the Masters Course will have 44 credits in a year with a total of 88 credits in two years. The baseline for total credits is 120 for a

3-Year course and 160 for a 4-Year course. So, a student can choose to have a total credit between 120 and 132 by the end of a 3-Year Bachelor Degree course.

Definition & Short title

Major

Major is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (50% of total minimum credits) through core courses in the concerned discipline.

> Minor

Minor is the discipline that helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the Major discipline.

> ABC

ABC or the "Academic Bank of Credits" refers to the initiative of the Ministry of Education, Government of India where a student"s academic credit is consistently deposited into the ABC.

> Internship

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

Eligibility

- (a) A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution.
- (b) Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference of Major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any Major, s/he will be admitted on the basis of preferences of the subject combinations.
- (c) Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a college / department.
- (d) No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless s/he fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.

Reservation

Statutory reservation policy of the Government of Assam shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.

Student can choose Major and Minor from the following pools (3 Programme /subject)

Requirements for admission

- i. Student Seeking admission to college shall have to apply in prescribe form available with the prospectus.
- ii. Major and Minor will be offered at the time of admission.
- iii. Students need to submit the following photo copies of documents:
 - a) Marksheet and pass certificate of the last examination (2 Copies)
 - b) HSLC Certificate, Marksheet, Admit card (for age verification), Each (2 Copies).
 - c) Character certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
 - d) Cast Certificate/ Gap period certificate/ Migration certificate/Disability Certificate if required.
 - e) Registration Certificate of AHSEC/GU (2 Copies)
 - f) It is mandatory that a student under GU-FYUGP register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies at the time of GU registration
 - g) In respect of reservation under games and sports quota and extracurricular activities, only state and national certificates from competent authority will be considers.
- iv. Original copies of certificates and mark sheets will be produced at the time of submission of online receipt.
- v. Students who secured position in Higher Secondary Examination are given admission without fees.

Eligibility for Admission

I. Admission to FYUGP 1ST Semester classes is open for those who have p[assed the HS (10+2) standard Examination conducted by Assam Higher

- Secondary Education Council or Central Board of Secondary (CBSE) or any other equivalent examination recognized by GU/DU or any other university.
- II. Admission will be strictly on the criterion of merit & governed by the college admission committee. The Principal's decision regarding admission is final.
- III. Seats are reserved for ST/SC/OBC/Physically Handicapped in accordance with the existing rules.
- IV. Preference will be given to the students having proficiency in Extracurricular activities under rules.
- V. Students who want to get admitted in 2nd Semester/3rd Semester/4th Semester/5th Semester/6th Semester must deposit their form and dues as per dates fixed by the college authority.

Attendance

- I. Minimum 75% attendance in each subject of a student is required to be eligible to in any final Examination.
- II. Continuous absence for 25 days in a class in enough to debar the concerned students attending the class or from appearing in the Final Examination.
- III. Scholarship holders with less than 75% attendance may be deprived of the scholarship.

College Examination

- I. In the present semester system 40% of total marks come from Internal Examination and rest 60 % from end semester evaluation.
- II. The Students must appear the sessional examination conducted by the college. No application seeking exemption from appearing the sessional examination will be entertained. However, if any student fails to appear in the sessional examination, due to some genuine, he/she will duly apply to the head of the dept. concerned and must appear in the sessional exam within 20 days from the completion of scheduled dates of each sessional exam.
- III. Nobody will be allowed to appear in the final examination without appearing the sessional examination conducted by the college.

Other amenities:

❖ Identity Card:

Every Student on Admission gets an identity card. It is obligatory for a student to hang the card in neck during his/her college hours. Loss of identity card will entail a fine of Rs. 100.00 for re-issuance. Students will receive fresh copy of identity card for each academic session.

➤ College Journal:

Hatichong College Magazine "GYANAM", Wall Magazine "ANURANAN" & Departmental Wall Magazines are published periodically. The corporation of students is highly solicited with a view to developing their inner potentialities.

➤ Central Library:

It is unnecessary to throw light on the utility of library, pertaining to imparting higher education through Degree College. Everybody is get acquit end with it. Having a look upon the matter, Hatichong College authority feels constrained to reveal with an immense pleasure that its library is well equipped, prigging with a number of thousands of books, daily newspapers, journals, comprising various strata. The chief object is to enlighten the students and teachers in the relevant fields. The Present Library was founded on the very first day of 2012 on the occasion of "Arunuday Divas" The foundation stone was laid by Hon"ble "Rangbang Terang" the Ex-President of Assam Sahitya Sabha.

- 4. Students must observe strict silence inside the College campus. Loitering in veranda is strictly prohibited during class hours.
- 5. Moving bicycle, bike is strictly prohibited inside the college campus. Students must keep their bicycles, bikes in the college area allotted for the purpose. (Cycle Stand)
- 6. The college campus is No smoking, No Tobacco, No Gutkha, no Drugs, No Alcohol, no Cracker zone. Spitting writing and sticking anything in the classroom boundary wall or inside the college building is an offence.
- 7. Ragging of any sort is strictly prohibited.
- 8. All powers for maintenance of discipline are vested with the Principal and his decision shall be final in all such matters.
- 9. Any notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere on the College premises shall require the approval of the principal. Nothing can be done in the college campus without the knowledge of and permission from the college authority.
- 10. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college dues, showing discourtesy to the teachers and office staff and Senior Students in any form etc. are some of the offences which may make students liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.

Guidelines for free admission of TDC 1stSem& 3rd Semester in the Year 2023-24

Students whose parental annual income is less than Rs.1Lakh from all sources will be eligibility to avail to get free admission. If either of the parent of the student is working in the state govt./central govt./ semi govt./ state and central govt. undertaking such students shall not be eligible to get free admission.

Proof of income/Documents required:

- 1. An income Certificate from the local revenue circle officer/Mauzadar.
- 2. A declaration from the student that neither of the parent (father or mother) of the Student is an employee of state / Central govt. department or its undertaking. Such form shall be devised by the concerned registrars/ Principals. If such a declaration is found to be false, the admission shall be cancelled and fee shall be realized from such students.

For the 3rd Semester only:

College will realize only magazine fees, games and sports fees and college week fees.

Duties of the Students Availing the Schemes:

Students seeking admission in to 1st year will plant a sapling at his/her college or at his/.her home and shall give photograph of the same to the college. The students have to nurse the sapling and while seeking admission into second year shall give

photograph of the same tree that was planted during previous year. Students availing the second year fee waiver benefit during the current year will also plant a tree and will nourish it and submit photograph of the same availing fee waiver benefit subsequently.
